<p>COVID-19 Risk Assessment</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Staff • Customers/visitors • Cleaners • Contractors/Builders • Delivery drivers • Vulnerable people, e.g. elderly, pregnant ,those with existing underlying health conditions 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Hand Washing</u> • Hand washing facilities with soap and water in place. • Stringent hand washing taking place. • See hand washing guidance • Drying of hands with disposable paper towels • Gel sanitisers in any area where washing facilities not readily available <p><u>Cleaning</u></p> <p>Frequently cleaning and disinfecting objects and surfaces that are touched regularly particularly in areas of high use such as door handles, light switches, reception area using appropriate cleaning products and methods.</p> <p><u>Drivers/ Deliveries</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Procedures in place for Drivers to ensure adequate welfare facilities available during their work - Reference • Persons should not share vehicles or cabs, where suitable distancing cannot be achieved. • Keep a distance from staff and workers <p><u>Wearing of Gloves</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Where Risk Assessment identifies wearing of gloves as a requirement of the job, an adequate supply of these will be provided. Staff will be instructed on how to remove gloves carefully to reduce contamination and how to dispose of them safely. <p><u>Mental Health</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Management will promote mental health & wellbeing awareness to staff during the Coronavirus outbreak and will offer whatever support they can to help. <p><u>Wearing of PPE</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Where Risk Assessment identifies wearing of PPE as a requirement of the job, an adequate supply of these will be provided. Staff will be instructed on how to wear/remove PPE carefully to reduce contamination and how to dispose of them safely. <p><u>Social Distancing</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Social Distancing -Reducing the number of persons in any work area to comply with the 2-metre (6.5 foot) gap recommended by the Public Health Agency • Taking steps to review work schedules including start & finish times/shift patterns, working from home etc. to reduce number of workers on site at any one time. Also relocating workers to other tasks. • Redesigning processes to ensure social distancing in place. • Conference calls to be used instead of face to face meetings. • Ensuring sufficient rest breaks for staff. • Social distancing also to be adhered to in canteen area and smoking area. • Strict designated work areas assigned to avoid unnecessary contact



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
